“Active Shooter in the School: How School Nurses Can Prepare” with Mike Clumpner, Threat Suppression Inc.

For School Nurses, School Administrative Staff, School Resource Officers, and other Emergency Personnel

Wednesday, June 7, 2017

Description:

Historically, the Carolinas have not been immune to school shootings. North Carolina has experienced at least 11 and South Carolina 9 school shootings. A common misconception is that school shootings are more commonplace in inner cities, when in fact smaller communities with less than 50,000 population are more often targeted. Numerous active shooter research studies have found that the majority of school shootings occurred in isolated rural or semi-rural areas known for relative stability and affluence (Cowen and Rossen, 2014). South Carolina is comprised of numerous smaller communities and has experienced an incident as recent as September of 2016, when a young child died from injuries sustained in a school shooting. In incidents such as these, school nurses may be the first responders in an active shooter incident. This course, consisting of both didactic and “hands-on” skills training, is designed to equip the participant with the knowledge and skills to more effectively respond in an active shooter or mass shooting situation. Dr. Mike Clumpner President, and CEO of Threat Suppression Incorporated, a public safety consultant firm, will conduct this comprehensive, full-day training for school nurses and other relevant disciplines involved in a coordinated response to school shootings.

Dr. Mike Clumpner is the President and Chief Executive Officer at Threat Suppression Incorporated, a public safety consulting firm located in Charlotte, North Carolina. Mike is also a full time fire captain/paramedic and acting fire battalion chief with the Charlotte Fire Department where he is assigned to a busy (3,500+ runs/year) inner-city ladder company. Mike is a 25-year veteran of the fire service, with 23 years' experience as a career firefighter/paramedic serving on high call volume fire companies. Mike is also the co-chair of the Charlotte Active Shooter Taskforce which was responsible for developing a unified public safety active shooter tactical response protocol for the United States' 16th largest city. The Taskforce was responsible for training 4,000 emergency responders on the new protocol. Mike was responsible for creating and directing 75 large-scale active shooter exercises, including several at one of the world's busiest airports. Mike is also the co-chair of the North Carolina Active Shooter/Active Assailant Work Group and he is a member of the federal government's Interagency Board where he serves as the lead for the Exercise and Training Subcommittee on the Active Shooter Best Practice Workgroup. Mike is recognized by numerous federal agencies as one of the United States' leading experts on active shooter response.

Mike is also a sworn law enforcement officer with the state's largest law enforcement agency for the past eight years where he has been assigned as an operator/senior tactical paramedic to a full-time, Type I SWAT team. Mike is one of the Department of Homeland Security's recognized active shooter response experts and has authored multiple DHS training programs on active shooter response. Mike is currently a member of several criminal/terrorism intelligence information networks and he serves as a Supervisory Field Liaison Intelligence Coordinator with DHS FUSION/NC ISAAC. Mike previously spent five years as an instructor for the United States Department of Justice in Quantico, Virginia, teaching numerous classes for the FBI, DEA, ATF, DHS, U.S. Marshals, and the White House Chief Medical Staff.

13. List the common responses to suicide and tragedy.
14. Discuss suggested interventions for teen suicide prevention
15. Discuss strategies in solutions in preventing lethal thoughts from becoming lethal actions.

Sue Klebold is the mother of Dylan Klebold, one of the two gunmen responsible for the Columbine High School shootings of April 20, 1999 in Littleton, Colorado. Dylan and his friend killed twelve students and a teacher, and wounded more than twenty others before taking their own lives.

In the aftermath of the tragedy, Ms. Klebold remained out of the public eye while struggling with devastating grief and humiliation. Her search for understanding would span over fifteen years during which she volunteered for suicide prevention organizations, questioned experts, talked with fellow survivors of loss, and examined the crucial intersection between mental health problems and violence. As a result of her exploration, Sue emerged a passionate advocate, dedicated to the advancement of mental health awareness and intervention. She has participated in presentations, co-chaired conferences at the state and national levels, and written about the experience of surviving a loved one's murder-suicide. She has a Master of Arts degree in Education from Cardinal Stritch College. She was an instructor and administrator in the Colorado Community College System for over twenty years.

From Columbia: Take I-20 E toward Florence, merge onto **I-95N** via **exit 141A** to **Fayetteville**, merge onto **SC-327 S** via **exit 170** to **Myrtle Beach**, then turn left at **E. Palmetto Street**.

Continue on **US-76E**, continue on **SC-576 E**. Slight right at **US 501-BR S**, continue on **US 501**. Take the **SC-31** ramp to **North Myrtle Beach**, merge onto **SC-31 N**, take the **International Dr. Exit**. Turn **left** at stoplight onto **International Dr/ Robert Grissom Parkway**. Keep straight on **International Dr**. The **Academy of Arts, Science, and Technology** will be on the **left** approximately two miles.
